



In-Person Worship Service Medical Questions and COVID-19 Guidelines (Version 3.22.21)

To help create a safe environment, the state of Connecticut has developed a series of health questions and guidelines to prevent potentially sick individuals from attending a church service and infecting others.

MEDICAL QUESTIONS

Please familiarize yourself with these questions and do not come to church if you exhibit the symptoms or have a temperature above 100.4 Fahrenheit. You will be asked the following questions immediately upon arriving at church:

Medical Question 1: Do you have either a cough or shortness of breath? If so, the state of CT identifies this as a potential COVID-19 symptom and we ask that you do not attend church this week.

Medical Question 2: Do you have any two of the following symptoms? If so, the state of CT has identified this as a potential COVID-19 symptom and we ask that you do not attend church this week.

- Fever
- Chills
- Repeated shaking with chills
- Muscle pain
- Headache
- Sore throat
- New loss of taste or smell

Temperature: Upon arriving, our welcome team will take your temperature using a digital non-touch thermometer. As a safety precaution, any individual whose temperature is above 100.4 Fahrenheit will be asked to not attend church that day. If you prefer, you can take your own temperature at home and report it to our team when you arrive.

Medical Comment:

- The state of CT strongly dissuades any member of the at-risk population from attending an in-person church service until they have been vaccinated. Anyone who chooses to attend acknowledges the health risks they are taking.

GUIDELINES WHILE AT CHURCH

- Please arrive at least 15 minutes before service so that our check-in process is as smooth as possible.
- Other than those participating on stage in the service, everyone must always wear a mask.
- Outside of your family, please make every effort to maintain a six feet distance from others.
- Only sit in designated rows and maintain a six feet distance from others outside of your family.
- For the safety and comfort of others we ask that you refrain from physical contact with people outside of your family (no hugging, handshaking, etc.).
