One of our values is Seeking God. As you reflect on the past year, how have you seen your faith in Jesus grow?



Tell us a little about yourselves and how you ended up at Walnut Hill.

We have been married for 30 years and have three children. We started attending Walnut Hill in 2008 and felt at home from the first day. Over the years, we've had the joy of serving on the Worship Team and in the Marriage Ministry. We also provide cleaning services for the Bethel and New Milford Campuses.

You've been at Walnut Hill for some time now but recently came into a season where you needed support from our Care Ministry. Can you explain your journey over this past year?

Cristiane was diagnosed with breast cancer in March 2023, beginning a difficult journey. Her first surgery, a double mastectomy, was in May 2023. She had a second surgery in May 2024, a third in September 2024 and a fourth in April 2025. Throughout this time, we've received incredible spiritual and emotional support. Pastors, Elders, brothers and sisters visited us, prayed with us, brought meals and even helped financially.

One of our values is Caring for One Another. How have you felt cared for through our Care Ministry this year? Are there any other ministries where you've also felt supported?

This year, we truly felt cared for through the Care Ministry. The love, prayers, visits, meals and financial support made a big difference during a very challenging time. We also felt supported by the Worship & Arts Ministry, Marriage Ministry, Women's Ministry and Walnut Hill's Brazilian community. Each one showed us the heart of the church in a special way — through encouragement, community and prayer. We're so grateful to be part of a church that genuinely lives out the value of caring for one another.

What excites you for this next year based on how you're seeing God at work in Bethel?

We're excited about the opportunity to continue serving and growing in community. We're especially looking forward to seeing how God will move through the Care Ministry and how He will use our story to encourage others who may be walking through difficult seasons.

Tell us a little about yourself and how you ended up at Walnut Hill.

I started coming to Walnut Hill in 2010. I attended the Bethel Campus, where I was involved in theater productions, Women's Ministry and Second Sunday. When they launched the New Milford Campus, I started attending there. I have a Crew that has been together for more than eight years. I have also participated in the wonderful Celebrate Recovery program for the past six years, and I coordinate the Angel Tree program for them.

Sports ministry, pickleball in particular, has had an incredible impact as an outreach to the New Milford community this year. Can you tell us how you have been impacted by this ministry?

My best friend started the pickleball program for New Milford Parks and Recreation. She asked me if Walnut Hill would let them play in the gym in the winter. Pastor Brian thought it was a great idea, and the program was born! By the end of the winter season, the program had grown to over 140 players coming each week, with more than 400 people registered to play.

One of our values is Reaching Out. How have you seen pickleball as an outreach for the church?

Pickleball has been a wonderful outreach program at Walnut Hill, allowing the opportunity to show love and kindness to people in the community through having pizza luncheons on the court, inviting people to special programs at Christmas and Easter, and introducing others to our church. We are also able to tell people about all the different programs and ministries we offer. We have had over 30 people come to Sunday services, and one gave their life to Jesus because of their participation in pickleball. The gym is filled all the time throughout the week.

What excites you for this next year based on how you're seeing God at work in New Milford?

It's exciting to see how pickleball has grown, and I look forward to seeing even more new people in the coming year. God is working in New Milford and His Son is shining.



Tell us a little about yourself and how you ended up at Walnut Hill.

I started attending the Valley Campus in the summer of 2022 and would describe myself as a "regular" ever since. Surprisingly, it was an FM radio advertisement that brought me in initially, but it was a combination of the welcoming congregation, a pastor who encourages questions and the grace of God that kept me coming back.

IGNITE LEGACY UPDATE

In 2018, our Lead Pastors launched the multi-year Ignite Legacy initiative to raise resources that would fuel new ministry opportunities and ignite a deeper passion for Jesus — both locally and globally. Now, in 2025, we're celebrating a milestone year as many of these initiatives have come to life. We want to pause and say **thank you** for your faithful support and to **praise God** for the incredible fruit we've seen together!

Here are just a few ways your generosity has made a lasting impact:

Online Campus Launch:


In 2019, we began planning for the launch of an Online Campus. The dream was to reach the next generation and those who might struggle to enter the doors of a church. By the grace of God, as our launch team prepared to begin in mid-2020, the onset of the pandemic fast-tracked our plans, and the campus launched on March 15, 2020. Only God could have known how powerfully this ministry would bless our church and sustain connection during those early months!

Today, more than 700 people gather online each week. In the past year alone, individuals from 39 states and 20 nations have joined us in worship!

Under Pastor Crystal Ellington's leadership, the Online Campus continues to thrive, welcoming first-time guests each week, keeping travelers and those sick connected, and providing a vital lifeline for those who are homebound. We regularly hear powerful testimonies of how God is meeting people right where they are. Praise God!

Pastoral Residency and Internship Program:

More than 30 men and women have been equipped in hands-on ministry — serving in areas like kids, youth, young adults, special needs, care, outreach, worship, production and more.

• Support for Rural Churches in Connecticut:

We've come alongside over a dozen churches, such as Greenwoods Community Church in MA, with pastoral care, preaching, prayer, financial help and opportunities for connection with other leaders.

Church Planting in Great Barrington:

We're preparing to launch Renaissance Church in September 2025, in partnership with Greenwoods Community Church, Valley Community Baptist Church and Converge.

Church in Action Partner Retreat:

We've invested in the spiritual health of our partners in Congo, Bangladesh, Macedonia, Rwanda and Thailand by providing life-giving spiritual refreshment.

• Special Needs Ministry Growth:

Funding from Ignite Legacy has provided five years of staffing, supplies and facility upgrades, including the renovation of our Bethel Campus' Friendship, Sensory and Community Rooms.

Debt Elimination:

We paid off church debt, freeing up resources to reinvest directly into daily ministry.

• Strategic Property Purchases:

Acquiring land next to our Bethel and Waterbury Campuses has opened the door for future growth, including the creation of a parking lot at our Waterbury Campus.

Campus Enhancements:

Major upgrades across our campuses have made our spaces more accessible, welcoming and effective for ministry. Examples include new and renovated bathrooms at the Waterbury Campus, new carpet and paint at the Bethel Campus, new windows, vinyl siding and roof at the New Milford Campus, and more.

We're filled with gratitude for all God has done and filled with faith for what's still to come. Thank you for being a part of this story!
